Mark your calendars for the upcoming programs:

May 18th Sherrill Lewis will be speaking on the history of beads and beading.

May workshop – Sherill will also teach a beading workshop at Alice Kellogg’s home that day. The class fee for this all day workshop is \$25 to be paid when you sign up. The kit for making a bead embellished needle case, will cost \$15 – paid at the class. All you need to bring to class is a pair of scissors and an embroidery hoop if you normally use one. Sounds like a terrific way to learn all about beading. Please contact Alice ASAP if you’d like to participate in this workshop.

June 15th – Deb Reinhardt will present a trunk show and talk about trading. Many of you have quilts that are the result of fabric swaps, block exchanges or other “trades”, we’d like to see them at this meeting.

July 20th – Janet Noever Seminole Patchwork: The Mother of Quick Quiltmaking July workshop... possible tote bag workshop. More details later.

August 17th – Susan Masters will speak about quilt labels.

Murphy’s Law of Quilting:

The last piece sewn before going to bed will be wrong side out.
When that corner piece finally goes in right, the bobbin will have run out!

If you drive 2 ½ hours to get to a highly rated quilt shop, they will be closed for inventory.
When you get new glasses, your previous quilting stitches will look like basting.
You've realized you've pricked your finger after the blood has dried on the quilt.
After you convince your husband you don't have time to iron his shirts, he finds you pressing fabric.
If you get 3 hours clear to quilt, the plumbing will burst.
You will run out of thread immediately prior to the last stitch.
The seam that needs to be redone is the one you double-stitched.
The chance of a bird bombing the quilt as it airs on the line is directly proportional to its value.
There is no other quilt in the world like yours, except for the one hanging right next to it in the quilt show.

****Special Report – Janet Noever The Donation Quilts Committee Report**

The Donation Quilts Committee met March 30, 2004. After extended debate, we voted to call this group and our product: “The Warm Fuzzies” (or WF’s for short). This first year we decided to divide the year into quarters and each quarter have a different recipient. The distribution is as follows:

**May through August: Baby quilts to give through ABC
September through November: Elderly and wheel chair quilts
December through February: Foster Children
March through May: Sick children**

The group voted to set up regular monthly sew-ins, one on the weekend and one during the week. To correspond with our guild calendar, we will meet on the THIRD Sunday and the THIRD Wednesday of each month. Our first sew ins are:

Sunday, May 16th St. Monica’s Catholic Church, from 1 to 4 p.m. at 2001 North Western Ave., Edmond (1/2 mile North of Danforth on Western) in the Parrish Hall, south of main building, in St Michael’s Room.

Wednesday, May 19th, Ruth Denny’s sewing studio, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at 1605 Mill Creek Road, Edmond (between Sante Fe and Kelly on Sorghum Road) Bring your sack lunch.

We decided to give ourselves a “shower” in June. A list of needed items will be distributed at the May EQG meeting, and we hope all EQG members will bring the items to the June meeting or make a cash donation to help get started.

There was great enthusiasm among the group, and they were eager to begin sewing. Our committee’s purpose was to set up the basics. Now we need the help and participation of the entire Guild.
