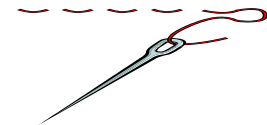
I don't know how to talk to you about this subject, so I will just throw it in your face. 😊

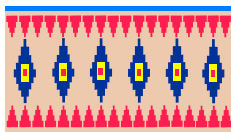
Are your Crayon Challenge quilts done?

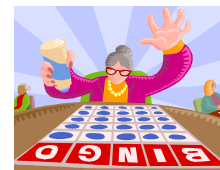


Program Report - Joan Ballew

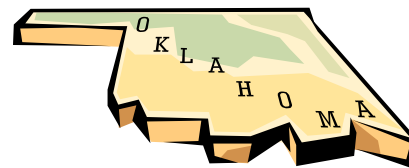
