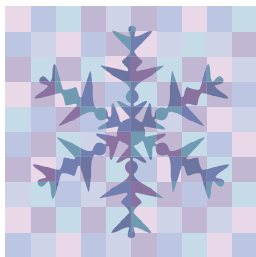

## President's Report- Alice Kellogg

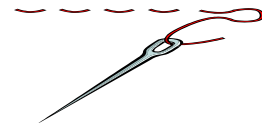

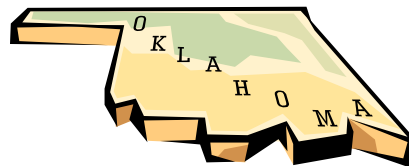
We plan to have the Categories for our Quilt Show available to you at the January EQG meeting.

New members are: Jo Ann Young and Nancy Myers of Edmond. Please make them feel welcome to the group.

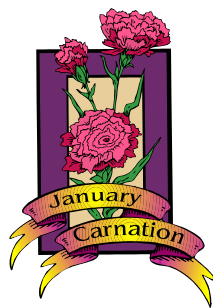

#### Community Outreach - Cheryl Boles

Since it is such a busy year, it is a good time to make something simple and easy to finish. I thought we would start out with cheery preemie quilts for Children's Hospital. Just as the little ones sizes vary, so do the quilts, from 15 inches square to 24 inches square and all sizes in between. An incubator cover is used to drape over the top of the incubator to keep the bright lights out of the little ones eyes and is 22 inches by 27 inches.

Also I was contacted by Citizens Caring for Children a week before Christmas with a request for 24 twin size quilts. There are 24 young men living in a dorm each requesting a quilt. So coming up is a work day or two at Hancock Fabrics dates TBA to make some fuzzy denim/flannel quilts. I believe I have all the denim and flannel needed to make these quilts.
