### The First Challenge of the Year

Our first challenge of the year will be a miniature quilt made from the fat quarter that you received at the Christmas meeting. If you don't have one of these, close your eyes and reach into a bag of fat quarters and pull one out.

What is a miniature? One dictionary meaning reads, "representation on a small scale," which assumes that the works in question normally exist on a larger scale.

For a miniature quilt and for this challenge:

- 1 No one side is larger than 20 inches with no minimum.
- 2 The swap fabric must be the dominate fabric in the quilt.
- 3 If you are using a block format, the block should not exceed 5 inches.
- 4 Put a sample of the swap fabric on the back of the quilt
- 5 NO whole cloth quilts.
- 6 The mini will be quilted and bound for the April EQG meeting.

Easy Speedy T-shirt Quilt Workshop Join us Saturday March 10th from 9am to 4pm in the Potter's Room at Memorial Road Church of Christ. We'll be using fusible batting instead of interfacing to stabilize the blocks for quilting, which is done BEFORE they are joined. Seam allowances go to the back of the quilt where they are clipped and curl into short, soft fringe when the quilt is washed. ## Membership Report– Debi Pickens

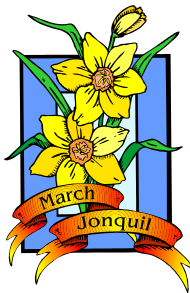

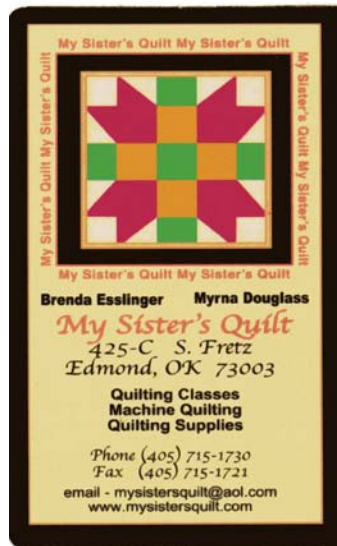
